Police Staff College Bangladesh (PSC) would like to congratulate and welcome Ms. Fatema Begum, Additional Inspector General of Bangladesh Police (Addl. IGP) on being appointed as Rector of PSC. She joined in PSC on October the 27th, 2014 as the successor of Mr. Nazmul Haque ppm who has departed on retirement. She is the first ever lady Rector at PSC and even the first ever Addl. IGP in the history of Bangladesh. Immediately before her joining, she was attached to the Police Headquarters (PHQ).

Ms. Fatema has extensive experience on policing in diversified fields including both operational and administrative jobs. She joined in Bangladesh Police on January 21, 1986 as an Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP) making a history of being the first BCS woman Police Officer. During her ASP tenure, she served as ASP (HQ) Tangail and ASP (Circle) Khagrachari. Being promoted to Addl. SP, she worked in CMP as ADC (HQ) and in Police Telecom. After getting promoted to the Superintendent of Police, she served as SP Telecom, SP Thakurgaon, AIG (Welfare), PHQ, SS (Protection) and SS (Admin) in SB. As Addl. DIG she served as Commandant, SB Training School and Director (Investigation) in RAB. She has an experience of working as DIG (Training), PHQ and DIG in SB.

Not only having her outstanding career in the national level, Ms. Fatema also excelled in foreign commitments. During the tenure at Thakurgaon, she went to Sierra Leone in UN Peacekeeping Mission for one year and was awarded Peace Medals for her outstanding service to Mission. Her passions for knowledge prompted her to the pursuit of a foreign degree from Adelaide University, Australia on Environmental Studies under the prestigious AusAID scholarship. She has contributed to various research journals during her study in the University of Dhaka (DU), Bangladesh and Adelaide University, Australia. Besides, she visited many countries of the world including the USA, UK, France, Australia, India, Philippines, Qatar etc.

Ms. Fatema has completed her post graduation from DU in Botany. She obtained her bachelor degree from Central Women's College, Dhaka. She was born on April 14 of 1958 in Munshiganj and is married in personal life.

Police Financial Management Course (PMC)

Core course for Additional SP

Police Financial Management Course (PFMC) is another core course of PSC offered to the Additional Superintendents of Bangladesh Police. PSC is very regular in conducting this course. In the September-December tenure, two PFMCs were organized. The 23rd & 24th PFMCs were conducted from 18 August to 04 September and from 16 November 2014 to 04

December 2014, respectively. Eighteen (18) participants of the 23rd and nineteen (19) of the 24th PFMC have participated and completed the course, whereas PSC's maximum capacity is twenty two (22). In total, thirty seven (37) Additional Superintendents of Police have been graduated in this course during this tenure. Of them, only four were women (10%).

The topics on which the course is based on are:

- Financial management issues of different Police units.
- Formulation of budget and other related topics.
- The responsibilities of Drawing & Disbursement Officer (DDO) in respect of budget, procurement, accounts and audit system.
- Public Procurement Regulation/ Act.
- Rules relating to pension, gratuity and other Govt. welfare funds. government audit and accounts system for different Police units
- Project planning, implementation and monitoring.
- An overview of income tax and related issues.
- Govt. audit system, audit observation and its settlement

Police Management Course (PMC) is the 3rd type core course of PSC among the four. PMC is offered for the Assistant/ Senior Assistant Superintendents of Police (ASP/ Sr. ASP). It is a three-week long course. In this quarter, PSC conducted three PMCs- the 27th, 28th and 29th in September, November and December respectively. In total, sixty (60) ASsP/ Sr. ASsP have been graduated in this course; of them only five (5) were women. Among the three, 28th PMC accommodated the highest number of participants (24),

which even exceeded PSC's maximum capacity (22) and the 29th had the exact number of participants (22), while 27th got the lowest (only 14). However, despite having the lowest number, 27th became unique in the last entire year by throwing a gala cultural night, usually known as Rector's night. Thanks to the incumbents of this course for such initiatives. The 27th PMC was coordinated by Mr. M.A Jalil, Deputy Director (Training), 28th by Rawshan Sadia Afroze, Deputy Director (Research & Publication) and 29th by Mr. Ruhul Amin, Assistant Director (Research & Publication).

The curriculum of this course is regularly updated according to the contemporary needs. In view of that, two topics have been inserted into the 28thPMC course curriculum as per the advice from the Government. These two topics are: National Integrity Policy and Autism. These are conducted by Mr. Md. Golam Rasul, MDS (Training) and Mr. Shafiqul Islam from Rajarbag Police Hospital, respectively. Moreover, this course becomes delightful with the presence of

PSC's aim is to make the training sessions more interactive at the same time truly effective. Hence, it encourages the inclusion of right instructor for the right topic no matter what the person would be other than the police, which not only makes the session fruitful &lively but also boosts up inter-services coordination. For example, PMC arranges training sessions to be conducted by the officials from Bangladesh Public Service Commission, Election Commission or even from Fire Services. This course has a program of field visit to the Police Liberation War Museum, Dhaka to get the young leaders realize about the sacred place of Rajarbag premise and what sacrifices had Bangladesh Police made in the liberation war of Bangladesh during 1971.

SPECIALIZED COURSE

Comprehensive Police Case Management Course (CPCM)

Specialized course for Addl SP

The Comprehensive Police Case Management course (CPCM) is a specialized course designed for the Additional Superintendents of Police, jointly organized by the PSC and CID. It is a six-week long course. In this tenure, PSC organized the 4th terms CPCM course from 19 October 2014 to 06 November 2014. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd CPCM were wholly organized at PSC. However, the 4th CPCM was divided into two parts. The first half was arranged at PSC and the rest at CID. Its specialty is that, every participant has to undergo

individual case docket analysis and present before the class regarding the strengths and weakneses of the case. Twelve Additional SsP from Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI), CID, Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) and DMP took part in the course. Mr. Mohammad Fayezul Kabir, Deputy Director (Curriculum) was the course coordinator of this course. As investigation is a vital part of policing, PSC is compelled to develop the course to provide an extensive knowledge on investigation to the participants. Hence, it covers a wide-ranging subjects focusing on investigation The areas it should cover

SPECIAL COURSE

Clarity on Functional Policing Course

Special course for the ASP Probationers

Clarity on Functional Policing Course is a kind of exceptional training course, rather than the regular in-service training of PSC. This course is specially designed for the ASP probationers who just finished both Sardah's basic training and district attachment. It has some specific purposes. First is to warm welcome the very fresh ASsp to this centre of excellence, so that their first steps in policing begin with a high morale, a step of inspiration for the young chaps. Second is to get them familiarized with the present policing system in Bangladesh so that the fresh minds can envisage and plan for its future betterment. And the last but not

the least, is to motivate them to embrace ethical and moral conducts maintaining honesty, integrity and professionalism in discharging their duties. With this aim, this course is designed with the sessions of high profile personnel ranging from government officials, intellectuals, academicians etc. For example, in this 4th batch, a session was conducted by Mr. H T Imam, Political Advisor to the Honorable prime Minister.

With this fourth course, the Clarity on Functional Policing course is concluded for now. The next course of this type will be opened upon the official welcome of the next BCS (Police) Batch.

Courses conducted with partnership Partnership with PRP, ATA, ICITAP & UNICEF

Not only with sole production, PSC also conducted courses in collaboration with national and international development partners, e.g. Police Reform Programme (PRP) from UNDP, both Anti-Terrorism Assistance Program (ATA) from US Department of State and

International Criminal Investigative Training Assistance Program (ICITAP) from US Department of Justice through the liaison of US Embassy and UNICEF etc. It is a regular phenomenon of PSC. In this tenure, PSC went for joint courses of four (4) with PRP, three (3) with ATA, one (1) with ICITAP and two (2) with UNICEF.

PRP conducted several types of courses namely, Training of Trainers course and Interview and Interrogation course. These are very short in duration courses, only three-day long. The training sessions are facilitated by local instructors, primarily from Police. 56 participants from the Interview & Interrogation Course and 18 from the ToT course have been awarded certificates.

Special Training of Trainers Course (ToT)

In this tenure, PSC & PRP jointly organized one special ToT course from 31 August to 04 September 2014. A total of 18 participants of the rank of ASP and Addl. SP attended this course. This course mainly focused on the police trainers who work on different police training institute. Its aim is to enhance their training

skill so that they can methodically and efficiently deliver their knowledge to the trainees. Usually, PRP courses are hosted by Mr. Md. Zahid Hossain Bhuiyan, Deputy Director (Administration). Mr. Andre Redman, Capacity Building Specialist, PRP was present in one of its graduation ceremonies.

Interview and Interrogation course:

Interviewing and Interrogation is the process by which an officer seeks, obtains and evaluates information given by persons having personal knowledge of events or circumstances of a crime. However, it is not an easy process, rather is a daunting task. Moreover, ambiguity is there between the terms of interview and interrogation. Are they similar in police investigation, or different? If so, how they should be managed? Keeping these in mind, PRP arranges another specialized course for the officers involved in police investigation

to enhance their investigation skill and to make them understand what the basic difference between interrogation and interview are and what should be the standard techniques for effective investigation. It is a three-day long course conducted one each in every month of this tenure: September, October and November. The participants were in the rank of Sub-Inspector and Inspector. These three training courses awarded certificates to a total fifty six (56) participants on their successful accomplishments.

PSC collaboration with US Embassy

Us Embassy has conducted a number of courses at PSC for the capacity building of Bangladesh Police officials in the arena of terrorism, transnational crime, human rights, corruption etc. In doing so, ATA is specific to counterterrorism and related phenomena while ICITAP possesses a comprehensive range of public safety related issues including terrorism, human rights, corruption, transnational crime and other national security related major crimes.

Similar to PRP, US Embassy sponsored courses are also conducted at PSC in a regular basis. However, unlike to PRP, these courses are facilitated by foreign instructors, and hence, there is a provision of language assistance for clear understanding of this course. Moreover, these courses are a bit longer than the PRP, usually ten (10) working days. In Sept-Dec. tenure, US Embassy, Dhaka organized three different types of courses. A total sixty one (61) participants from police and military have been awarded certificates after successful completion of their respective courses.

ATA conducted courses

Two (2) ATA courses have been accomplished within Sept-Dec. tenure, one was Fraudulent Document Recognition-TTT course and the other one Instructor Development Course (IDA) both in September. Both are of two-week long course with participants of

varying ranks ranging from Sub-Inspector to Addl. Superintendent of Police. Moreover in IDA course, officers from Special Security Force (SSF) in the rank of Major attended. A total of thirty four (34) participants have been awarded certificates after their successful completion.

Instructor Development Course

The very aim of this training is to make the participants confident in delivering and facilitating training sessions. The participants are taught on adult education, conceptualized with the difference between

education and training, prepared to develop lesson plan, acquainted with different training methods &methodology. Besides, the participants had to undergo individual teaching practice session in a class room environment. The instructors were Mr. Richard Wallace, Mr. Robert Muehlenhort and Mr. Scott Delong. A total seventeen (17) participants were graduated from this course in the rank of Sub-Inspector, Inspector, ASP/Sr. ASP, Addl. SP, Assistant Director (AD) and Major. Among the participants, only two (2) were women. The participants' units were one (1) from Border Guard Training Center Bangladesh, one (1) from Traffic and

Driving School (TDS) Dhaka, four (4) from CID, two (2) from PSC, one (1) from Special Security Force (SSF), two (2) from SB, one (1) from PBI, one (1) from DMP, one (1) from Bangladesh Police Academy Sardah, two (2) from PTC Khulna &Tangail each and one (1) from Fire Services and Civil Defense. Women's participation was very insignificant.



ICITAP Headed Courses

ICITAP had arranged one course titled 'Major Case Management Training' in October. Similar to ATA courses, ICITAP courses are also two-week long; however, participants are from the command levels, such as ASP,

Additional SP, SP or even Deputy Inspector General (DIG) from Bangladesh Police and the counterparts from Bangladesh Army or other government organizations.

Major Case Management Training Course

PSC and ICITAP jointly organized 'Major Case Management Training Course' during 18 October 28 October 2014. This course is designed for command-level officers and managers from law enforcement, civil defense, emergency management, fire, emergency medical and rescue, public health, and other locally identified public safety entities and government administrative personnel whose duties and responsibilities are vital during critical incident management, policy development, planning, and program evaluation. The training sessions were conducted by foreign instructors: Mr. Rolland Avedician Jr., Mr. Matteo Valles Jr. and Mr. Michael B. Hood. The course is a two-week course focusing on transnational investigative techniques, the enterprise theory of investigation, forensic evidence collection, crime scene management, post bomb blast investigation,

introduction to bomb crime scene processing, interview and interrogation, report preparation, financial crimes investigations, terrorism financing and money laundering and country case consultation. It is designed with a wide range of practical exercises which made it interactive and interesting. In this course, a total of twenty seven (27) participants of the rank of ASP, Addl. SP and Major attended the course, of them only two were women. Among the participants, nine (9) ware from Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP), seven (7) from Police Bureau of Investigation (PBI), four (4) from Criminal Investigation Department (CID), five (5) from Special Branch (SB), and two (2) were from Rapid Action Battalion (RAB). As a whole, ten (10) were Addl SP, while one was Major and the rest were ASsP/Sr. ASsP. It is highlighted that DMP's participation was the highest among other units, the lowest was from RAB. On the all the hand, women participation was very negligible.

In this term, Major Case Management Training was highlighted enough with the gracious presence of Mr. David Meale, Deputy Chief of Mission and His Excellency Mr. Dan W Mozena the Ambassador, Embassy of the United States of America, Dhaka both as Chief Guest in its inaugural and closing ceremony respectively. ACTIVITIES OF RESEARCH PLANNING & EVOLUATION (RP & E) WING

PSC has a separate research wing which was introduced two years ago. It has some dedicated officers to pursue its research activities. Among them, Mr. Md. Matiur Rahman Sheikh, MDS (Research, Planning and Evaluation) can be considered as the cornerstone of this wing. He is followed by very devoted police personnel Mr. Mohammad Shahjahan ppm, Director in-Charge (Research, Planning and Evaluation), an appropriate second-in command of him. These leaderships are assisted by a dedicated research team.

PSC has done some significant contribution to its endeavor for excellence under the able leadership of Mr. Matiur. The remarkable achievements are:

Research Highlight:

PSC Journal, October 2014 has been published Publication of Newsletter Sept-Dec issue Four research projects are in progress.

Similarly, this wing accomplishes all evaluation tasks of the training courses and oversees the term paper works of the participants. The wing introduced a new style of evaluation system for the participants, started from PEMC course. The participants are now evaluated on the basis of their critical thinking ability on some specific issues using open source information. Besides the individual critical analysis, term paper manuscript and its presentation are another important part of evaluation system. PSC's Research, Planning & Evaluation wing is responsible to supervise this part of training. This wing makes a continuous research on selecting term paper and rigorously maintains the training requirement of developing the cognitive skill

administering research projects on policing issues and publishing the outcome; a regular publication of PSC journal, Newsletter and Annual Report; press release of important events and so on. With these research findings, the planning section of this wing provides new ideas and concepts for strengthening training activities and increasing its effectiveness.

In this continuation, PSC's RP & E wing published its October 2014 journal in a regular manner. In this volume, total seven (7) articles have come out successfully with the issues on quality investigation, dynamic of policing, dynamics of urban crimes in dhaka, victimization of garments workers, problems associated with criminal investigation and macroeconomics.

of the participants. Correspondingly, PSC pays special attention to term paper construction and referencing style. That's why, the allocated marks for this assignment are increased and APA referencing style has been introduced and maintained very rigorously. The total marks for the evaluation is re-allocated to be fit the above fashion. Participants' critical thinking ability is considered as the top-level evaluation indicator (60%), followed by term paper (30%) and at the bottom level is class performance (10%).

Research Project 1:

Exposure of Illegal Firearms' and Potential Threats in National Security: An Assessment.

The prime researcher: Mr. Prakash Chandra Roy

Synopsis: Illegal firearms are extremely lethal weapon to spread panic, malice and fear of crime in a society. A very densely populated country like Bangladesh has greater impact of a crime occurred by firearms. Here, firearms not only can injure a greater number of people from the single criminal act but also can traumatize many more. There are a number of arms recovery cases handled by Bangladesh Police and Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) which points out the significant existence of illegal firearms in Bangladesh. There is also an upward trend in crimes associated with firearms, observed in the crime statistics. The research is based on mixed methods which aims to analyze the nature and extent of illegal firearms' involvement in crime and violence in Bangladesh and intended to anticipate the future trends accounting for Bangladesh for its recent socio-economic changes.

Research Progress: The details Inception plan has been developed, literature review has been accomplished, research tools have been finalized and questionnaire & check have been produced.

The research outcome is expected to reveal at the end of this financial year.

Research Project 2:

Understanding Police Investigation and Operation in Bangladesh: A Base Line Survey (Phase II)

Main Researcher: Mr. Towhidul Alam Chowdhury

Synopsis: Investigation is essential to in ensuring criminal justice. Still now in Bangladesh, many law enforcing agents have the authority to conduct investigation. However, the performance of those organizations does not meet the public demand. It is obvious that police is entrusted in investigation as per Criminal Procedure Code. The present study is the Phase II of the Baseline Survey earlier conducted by the Agenda for Culture and Society (ACS). Limitation is that, ACS was unable to include all PBI PSs due to budget constraints. The study is a cross-sectional one and relevant quantitative and qualitative data will be collected from both primary and secondary sources. The study will try to establish a database in addition to the earlier which would be used by the PBI to address the issues relating to police investigation and operation more specifically emphasizing the loop holes regarding FIR, limitations of investigation, causes of acquittal, type of cases and situation of major case management including schedule cases of PBI.

Research Progress: Research design has been developed, literature review has been accomplished, research tools such as questionnaire & check list have been finalized and a pilot survey is in progress.

The expected date of completion is at the end of this financial year.

Research Project 3:

Pattern of Service Delivery System in Police Station: Urban and Rural Perspectives PSC

Main Researcher: Mr. Towhidul Alam Chowdhury

Synopsis: The police provide vital services to individual members of the public as well as to society as a whole. Many of us depend on them for information and advice and for help when we are victims of crime; and in turn the police depend heavily on the active support of the general public in the fight against crime. The police service must routinely consider 'what best looks like' from the individual citizen's viewpoint and aim to meet and exceed that standard. But in Bangladesh, most of the people always claim that they are not getting better services from police whereas police stated that they constantly try their best to serve the people though they have different types of limitations. In this research, both methodological triangulation (quantitative and qualitative) and data triangulation (primary and secondary source) methods will be used. The research is based on triangulation of Survey, KII and FGD. Moreover, secondary review will be carried out for the enhancement of the study.

Research Progress: Research design has been developed, literature review has been accomplished, theoretical framework has been prepared, research tools such as questionnaire & check list have been finalized.

The expected date of completion is at the end of this financial year.

Research Project 4:

Stakeholder's expectation: challenges and potentialities of tourist police (a study on Cox's Bazar and other tourist place).

Main Researcher: Mr. Mujib Ahmmad Patwary

Synopsis: Tourism offers immense potentiality for employment generation, poverty alleviation and maintaining ecological balance. Although Bangladesh Tourism Industry has a very high potentiality, there are some challenges hindering the proper utilization of such potential opportunities. The most challenging factor is the lacking of ensuring the security of the visitors. Tourist police is a new introduction to Bangladesh considering such weaknesses. The study is mainly the dynamics of tourist police and its expected outcome.

This study had the following research question:

What are the expectations of the tourist stakeholders from the tourist police?

What type of security measures have been ensured by them and how the effective security can be provided?

What are the strength and weakness of them?

What types of underlying potentialities are in the newer unit of Bangladesh police

What types of challenges are faced by this unit and how to solve these?

Research Progress: Research design has been developed, literature review has been accomplished, theoretical framework has been grounded, finalizing of research tools such as questionnaire & check list is in progress.

The expected date of completion is at the end of this financial year.

DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

Vertical Extension of Administrative Building:

Administration building expansion work is going on in order to accommodate Vice Rector's Office, a conference room with a capacity of 150 seats and a big library. Besides, a well-facilitated Mock test room is being constructed for simulation and other training purposes. About 80% of the construction work has been completed which is financed by the Government of Bangladesh. Hopefully, this project will be completed by the financial year 2014-2015.

Vertical Extension of Dormitory Building:

The expansion work of third floor of the dormitory building is in progress. After completion, this floor will be able to provide twenty six (26) more rooms for the trainees which will, hopefully, be finished by the end of 2014-2015 financial year. This project is also financed by the Government of Bangladesh.

Future development proposals:

PSC has some future strategies in accordance with its master plan. The future development projects of this college include:

- Establishment of Rector's/Vice Rector's Bungalow
- Establishing Academic Building According to the PSC New Master Plan
- Establishing Multistoried Housing for the Officers at all level
- Barrack Establishment for the Forces/Guards
- Building of Mosque
