

Evaluation of the course

To evaluate this course, participants have opined that this course has opened up a new chapter before them with renewed attitude regarding the management activities as a police manager. Through group discussions and problem-solving exercises, they have already developed innovative strategies, honed their managerial skills, and grasped the concept of multi-jurisdictional information sharing. This course contents have fulfilled their expectations through and by developing present and future leadership; making them acquainted with different systems of policing like pro-people & intelligence based policing; acquiring knowledge on case management, supervision and office management at unit level. Moreover, they have learnt how to use the digital equipment and technology along with the modern management thoughts and gathered the knowledge to examine the latest trends and patterns of crime in home and abroad.

The knowledge and attitude they got from this course is considered sufficient enough to get the ability to adore and flourish themselves with the highest professional competency in their area of responsibilities. After the completion of the course, the participants are now confident in managerial issues bestowed to them. On the other hand, they have put some recommendations like duration of the course can be increased up to four weeks; more exercises and tests can be included to make the course more fruitful and visit to police station can be arranged to make the course more effective.

PMC is an effective and pragmatic course for the Assistant Superintendant of Police. It is obvious that this training program has enabled them to be more confident in policing through sharing experiences and exchanging ideas with the experienced and prudent instructors. They would be able to discharge their duties and responsibilities through practicum of this training program better than they could do.

Training of Trainers on Human Rights

The effective training of police in human rights is an essential element in the global efforts to promote and protect human rights in every country. In order to protect human rights, the police must first know and understand the fact that international human rights standards concerning their work were developed to provide invaluable guidance for the performance of their crucial functions in a democratic society. Keeping this in mind, Bangladesh Human Rights Commission and UNDP jointly organized a ToT course for police officers of the rank of Sub-Inspector to Additional SP. Twenty-Eight officers from different units of Bangladesh Police took part in the course from 04 to 05 March 2014.

Course Objectives

The overall objectives of this course are to emphasize that knowledge of human rights is an essential professional requirement of all personnel serving in law enforcement agencies, to clarify the idea about policing in a democratic society and to have a sound knowledge about the maintenance of public order especially during the election period.

Presentation and Facilitation Skills

Making presentations can be a daunting task, particularly when the issue comes for many people as public speaking. Finding ways to calm those jitters, adequate and appropriate preparation, structure and delivery of material are essential to successfully getting message across. Therefore Police Reform Program (PRP), UNDP organized a four-day training program on Presentation and Facilitation Skills from 27 April to 30 April 2014. There were 14 participants of the rank of Sub-Inspector to ASP participated in the course.

The very aim of this training is to make the participants confident in presentation and facilitation skills so that they are able to facilitate different training sessions in different in-service training institutions of Bangladesh Police. The participants are taught adult education, difference between education and training, lesson plan, different methods & materials of training. Besides, the participants had hands-on exercise on conducting a session in class room environment.

Border Control Management Course

Border Control Management is a two-week course for mid-level to senior-level border control managers and supervisors with in sight operational responsibility for border ports of entry. This course is intended to introduce the tools and techniques required to understand and address current border management issues. Border Control Management (BCM) Course was held at Police Staff College Bangladesh from 02 to 13 February 2014. The course was sponsored by U.S. Department of State Anti-Terrorism Assistance (ATA) Program and coordinated by the Regional Security Office, U.S. Embassy, Dhaka. Twenty-Six officers from Bangladesh Police, Bangladesh Army, Border Guard Bangladesh, Coast Guard Bangladesh, Customs & Excise, and Immigration & Passport Office participated in Border Control Management Course.

Through a series of lectures, discussions, and problem-solving activities, the participants learnt how to identify terrorism threats to borders and solutions for neutralizing and mitigating those threats. They also learnt about current terrorist methods and threats, including awareness of chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) materials and the equipment and methods used to build these devices.

The course covered such topics as respecting human rights, trends in terrorism, conducting a threat assessment, physical and operational vulnerabilities at the border, combating vulnerabilities at the border, controlled materials at the border, managing personnel and equipment, communication at the border, preservation of evidence, integrity controls, providing information to the public, and interagency & international cooperation.

At the conclusion of this course, the participants will be able to:

- Plan, organize, and manage border operations.
- Develop plans and methods for better port of entry security.
- Develop guidelines for the dissemination of intelligence.
- Coordinate efforts among agencies.
- Implement border monitoring equipment and techniques.

Identifying and Developing Investigative Information (IDII) Course

Investigation plays the most important role in the detection and prevention of crime. There is no denying the fact that we are lagging behind the international standard in terms of applying investigation techniques. Our conventional approach to investigation does not match the organized criminal networks at local, regional and international levels. So, we have to apply global investigation techniques to strengthen our investigation. Keeping this in mind, 'Identifying and Developing Investigative Information(IDII)' Course has been arranged for field level Police Officers who are mostly engaged in investigation in their day to day professional activities.

The course was held from 23 February to 06 March 2014 and 31 participants of the rank of Sub-Inspector to Addl. SP attended the course. "Identifying and Developing Investigative Information" was developed to provide the participants with the knowledge and skills they need to plan, establish or enhance the capability of, and effectively manage a law enforcement intelligence unit. The participants examined best practices for establishing or improving investigative information, and gained knowledge and skills needed to effectively manage both the analytic process and work with those contributing to the process.

Developing investigative information is indispensable for law enforcement investigators or investigative information analysts who are knowledgeable of current radical tactics and practices. In addition, it is so important to be well-known with the investigative information, identifying process, analysis, latest thinking on investigative analysis, intelligence process, information sharing, terrorist motives and adapt at problem solving in a variety of instructional strategies, through group exercises, demonstrated management and administrative experience. The skill and knowledge gained through the IDII course will obviously enhance the participants' ability to use innovative strategies and apply effective analytical methods to improve their abilities to identify and develop investigative information.

Workshop on 'Role of Police in Environment Protection'

Police Staff College Bangladesh and Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association (BELA) jointly organized a daylong workshop at the International Conference Centre (ICC) of PSC on "Role of Police in Environment Protection". The workshop was held on 12 February 2014. Twenty-seven participants took part in the workshop.

Dr. Ainun Nishat, Vice Chancellor, BRAC University, and water resource and climate change specialist, spoke about 'Environmental Issues and Concerns: National and International Perspectives' as well as 'Sustainable Development: Issues and Concerns in Bangladesh'. His discussion was divided into three sections covering global, regional and national issues. He talked elaborately about global issues like 'Climate change and climate variability', 'Desertification processes', 'Loss of biodiversity' and 'Ozone layer depletion'. Regional issues like 'Water regulation in upper reaches', 'Deforestation in upper watershed', 'Cross-boundary Pollution', 'Threat of oil spillage' and 'Over-Fishing in the Bay' came alive in his speech. Then he focused on national issues like 'Population and bearing capacity', 'Food security, water security, energy security, health security and security for livelihood', 'Sustainable Agriculture', 'Depletion of Forest resources', 'Disappearance of Wetland and Fisheries', 'Loss of Biodiversity and medicinal plants', 'Rapid Urbanization' and 'Degradation of natural resources base'.

Syeda Rizwana Hasan discussed the 'Role of Police in Enforcing Environmental Laws'. She pointed out duties and responsibilities of police on environmental issues focusing on relevant articles and sections of the Constitution, the Police Act 1861, the Penal Code 1860, the Environment Conservation Act 1995, the Water Act 2013, the Brick Burning (Control) Act 1989, the Building Construction Act 1952, Wildlife (Preservation and Safety) Act 2012, and local government laws.

Basic Interview Skill

Basic Interview Skill Course was held at Police Staff College Bangladesh from 23 February to 06 March 2014 with the initiative of the Government of Denmark and the United States of America. Twenty-One participants of the rank of Sub-Inspector and Inspector attended the course.

Interviewing is the process by which an officer seeks, obtains and evaluates information given by persons having personal knowledge of events or circumstances of a crime. The course is intended to enhance the capabilities of the investigating officers in Identifying and Developing Interview skills. In the graduation ceremony, Mr. Md. Nazmul Haque PPM, Rector, Police Staff College Bangladesh was present as the chief guest. Mr. Jon F. Danilowicz, Deputy Chief of Mission, US Embassy Dhaka and Mr. Duncan Brown, Senior Adviser, Royal Danish Embassy Dhaka, were present as special guest. Mr. Md. Bangladesh lacks a functioning juvenile justice system. The legislation covering juvenile justice is still inadequate. It is very poorly enforced; rather it is covered with confinement of children in a separated environment. The principle of diversion (diverting children from the justice system through the provision of support and care services), is the cornerstone of international standards on juvenile justice but is not yet well practiced in our home country. A key limitation of our system is that the child victims of crime, witnesses and children alleged of committing crime are put forwarded very often into the same system, set for the adults not giving much attention to the child protection service. The workshop was an attempt to bring the officers in one platform so that they can coordinate and have multiple effects on the juvenile system.


