The 17th Board of Governors Meeting:

Boosting up the team spirit to work with more vigor and vitality

The 17th meeting of the Board of Governors (BoG) of Police Staff College was held at its campus on September 22, 2020 presided over by the Chairman of the Board Honorable Minister of Home Affairs, Mr. Asaduzzaman Khan, MP. With the kind permission of the Chair, SK. Md. Maruf Hasan bpm, ppm, Rector, PSC and Member Secretary of the board welcomed and expressed his gratitude to the presence before commencing the proceedings.

The Member Secretary stated that the board meeting was delayed due to the pandemic situation of Covid-19. Furthermore, he added that nearly all the decisions taken by the previous board meeting have been implemented except some decisions due to the administrative and practical limitations. He hoped that with the instructions and suggestions of the board members, the unfulfilled tasks would be completed very soon.

The meeting yielded the following decisions:

- Outsourcing practice is to be continued for smooth conduction of education and research activities.
- Research report of Bangabandhu's Vision of Law Enforcement: Policing in Bangladesh." should be finalized and published as early as possible.
- Cyber Security" and" Security Management" - Post Graduate Diploma courses are approved by the BOG.
- New posts and the grades of PSC are approved by the BOG.
- Overseas training following the best practices of the developed and developing countries is to be emphasized. It has been approved by the BoG that the duration of overseas training needs to be prolonged from 7 days to 14 days.
- DPP of the PSC should be finalized and sent to MoHA for further necessary steps.
- Proposal for the amendment of Police Staff College Act, 2002 is to be sent to the concerned ministry.
- Necessary actions are to be taken to arrange the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with other government & No-government organizations.
- Inclusion of Additional IGP (HRM), Police Headquarters, as board member has been approved by the BoG.

Dr. Benazir Ahmed, BPM (bar), Inspector General of Bangladesh Police insists that the meeting will be held on a regular basis. He also asserts the continuous support of the board members.

Asaduzzaman Khan, MP, Honorable Chairman of the Board and also the Minister, Ministry of Home Affairs appreciates the Rector for organizing the meeting successfully. He added that the change of policing is visible now. Bangladesh police is very much capable to control and restraint terrorism and militancy. He further goes on to emphasize the compulsory training course for the senior police officers. He assures the support for the overall development in the education, training, and research activities of PSC.

The member secretary expresses his deepest gratitude to the board members. He affirms that Police Staff College is committed to carrying its endeavor in molding skilled, capable and professional police officers to meet the expectation of the nation in the coming days. Further he expressed condolence to his predecessor, respected Ex-Rector of PSC, Ms. Rowshan Ara Begum, PPM, ndc, who died on 5th May, 2019 by a road accident in Congo. She was one of the pioneering female police officers of Bangladesh Police. He prayed for salvation of her departed sole.

He is a laureate with ndc after a successful accomplishment of the National Defense Course in 2014. He was awarded Ph.D. on Development Studies in early 2018.

Mr. Nazibur Rahman has developed a passion for justice and equality since his childhood and adolescent years. As a result, after earning a Master's degree, he began his professional career in the Bangladesh Civil Service (Police) of the Government of the Peoples' Republic of Bangladesh on 15th February, 1988. He worked in many capacities such as SP, Sirajganj and Bandarban District, As DIG he worked of APBn, Police Telecom, Police Commissioner of Khulna Metropolitan Police and Principal of Bangladesh Police Academy, Sardah, Rajshahi.

He has a versatile experience of many other important assignments in the home and abroad. He worked as a senior Diplomat for a considerable period in the capacity of Minister (Consular) at the Bangladesh High Commission in New Delhi, India. He attended different training courses at home and abroad (UK, USA and Italy). He is an adjunct faculty in the Mowlana Bhashani Science and Technology University (MBSTU), Tangail. He is also a resource person in the National Academy for Planning and Development, Dhaka, Bangladesh. He worked in different peacekeeping missions of the United Nations. PEMCC (SP) Course Curriculum:

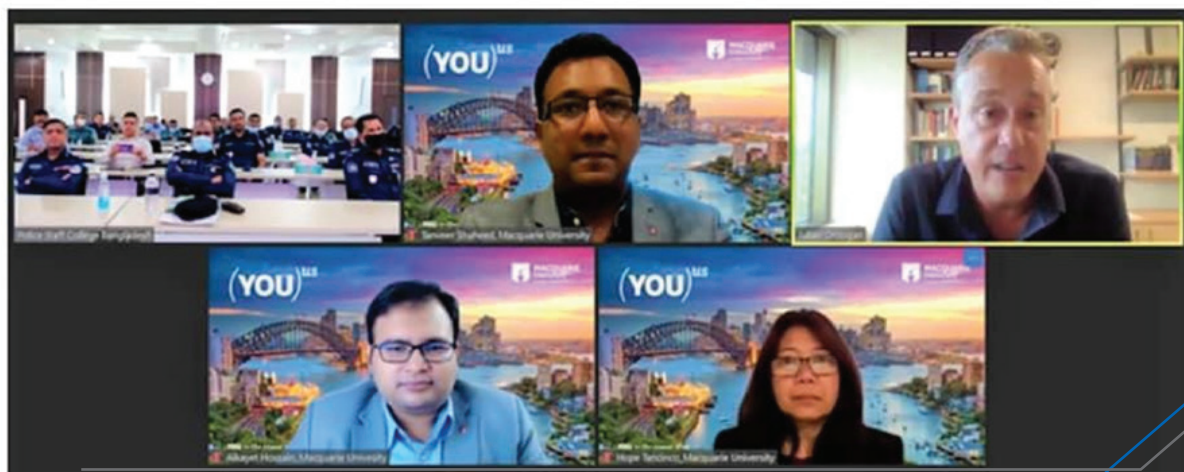
For SP level, there are a total 09 modules out of which 08 modules are subjects and the 9th module is the Term Paper Presentation.

15th Crime Administration Management Certificate Course (CAMCC): for Circle ASPs / Addl. SPs

PSC has conducted one CAMCC in this tenure. The 15th CAMCC course held from 6/12/20 to 17/12/20, graduated 22 Police Officers from diverse units. The insights of this course is to provide knowledge and skills for crime prevention and its management, case supervision and inspection to Circle supervisors. CAMCC focuses on Circle ASP's/ Additional SP's crucial role in administering their jurisdiction. Participating officers learn the skills necessary for obtaining proper evidence, evaluating the proper investigation, filing legal documentations and supervising criminal cases.

The participants in CAMCC course will also learn about different aspects of the duties and responsibilities of Circle ASP. The course will make them capable of analyzing evidence, following potential leads and solving crimes. They may also learn how to work in tandem with community members, how to make inter and intra-communication with other government organizations and how to deal with potential witnesses and victims. This course uses a multidimensional approach with a wide range of topics including inspection, supervision, policing strategies, leadership and technology.

The modules within this course include: a) Circle Office Management, b) Police Inspection, c) Police Case Supervision, d) Crime and Intelligence Management, e) Presentation (Group & Individual)

The research works here are regulated under Police Staff College Act 2002. PSC's Research Branch is dedicated to conducting or arranging workshops, conferences, and seminars on policing, criminology, justic security and terrorism issues.

This year PSC undertook 02 research projects on diverse stimulating areas encompassing policing and criminological issues. Subject matter experts were assigned with each of the projects to coordinate with the researchers. Researchers were required to present the progress of the projects before the faculty from time to time. In this connection, PSC, at different times, arranged workshops on research methodology of the ongoing research projects one apiece for each of the projects in order to know and ascertain the progress of the researches. In animated conversations, faculty members gave their opinions and put valuable suggestions so that the most accurate results come out.

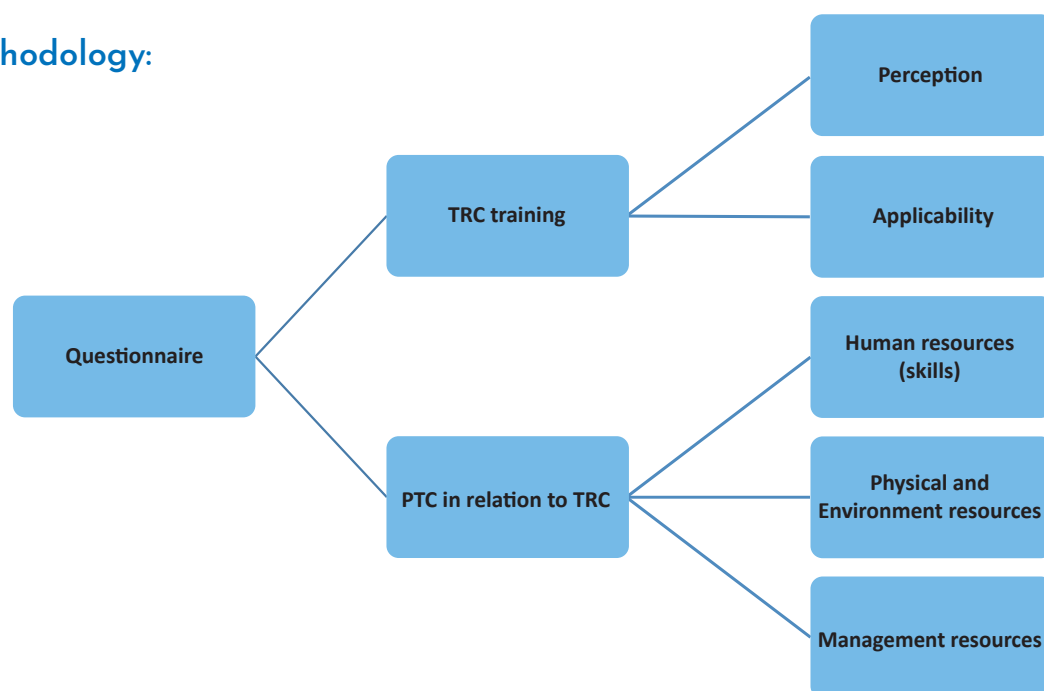

To achieve the above dimensions of the general objective, the following research questions have been formulated:



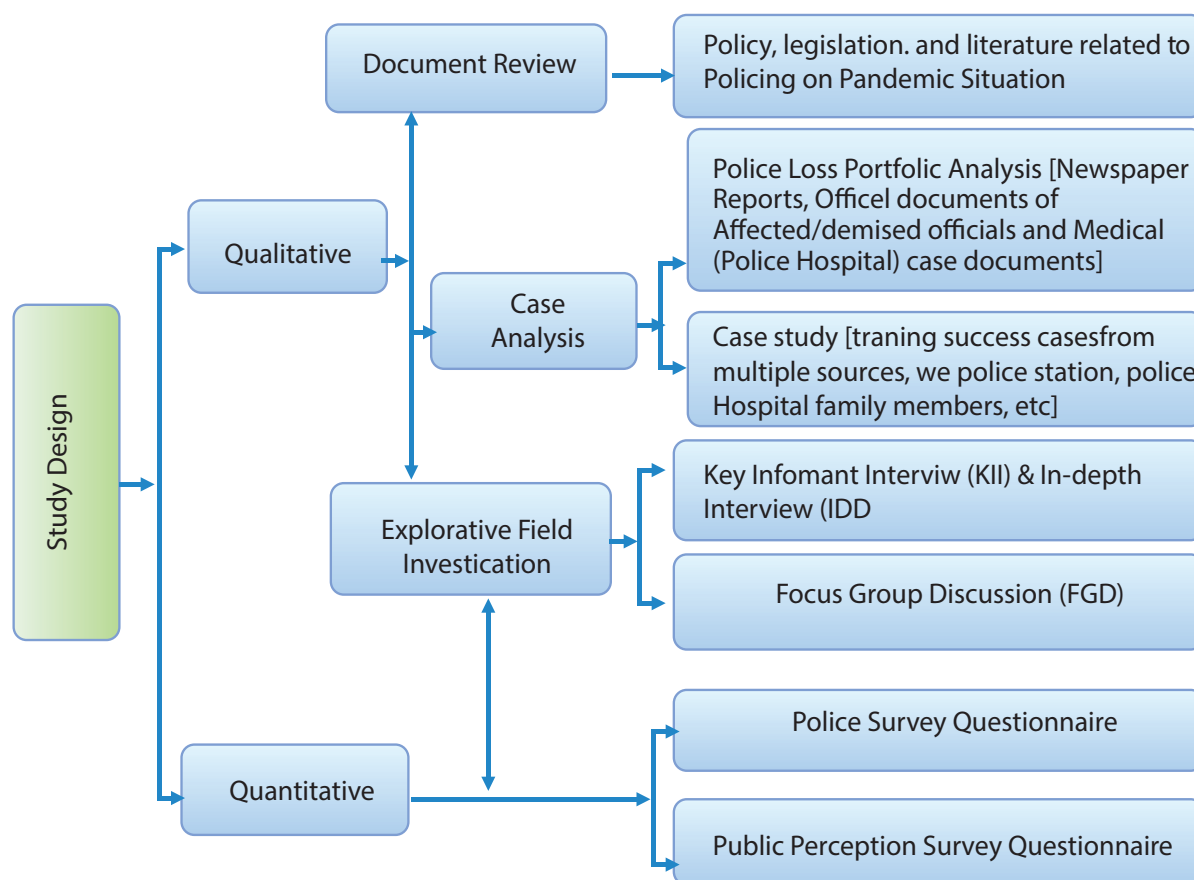

4. What are the perceived reasons for casualties of Bangladesh police in performing their duties during the pandemic situation?

5. What lessons do Bangladesh Police learn and experience gained through performing their duties in a pandemic situation?
6. What success do Bangladesh Police have in managing their responsibilities in this health emergency?
7. How do Bangladesh Police could utilize their learnings and experiences for professional development and better services to the Nation in future?

The above mentioned research questions help to guide the selection of research methods and techniques that were thought most appropriate to provide inside explanations by illuminating the data of the present research.

The 5th "Masters of Applied Criminology and Police Management" Course was inaugurated on 14th September, 2020 at Police Staff College Bangladesh. Mr. Md. Matiur Rahman Sheikh Rector (Acting), Police Staff College Bangladesh. was the chief guest of the program and special guest was Mr. Mohammed Bin Kashem, Ph.D. Dean (Curriculum), National University, Md. Golam Rasul, MDS (A & R), Police Staff College Bangladesh presided over the inaugural ceremony. High officials of Bangladesh Police, Teachers from different Universities, Students of the Master's program and Faculties of Police Staff College Bangladesh attended the ceremony.

ASP to SP of Bangladesh Police and other students from different professions took admission in the MACPM program. In this 2019-2020 Session 34 Students enrolled in the program.

This program focuses on crime reduction policy and practices along with the development of leadership skills, which will help to strengthen professional knowledge and skill on policing. This course is open to all for three important reasons, these are:

1. The non-police students are expected to be social worker, human rights activist, lawyer or media personnel so it is very likely that this course would be a wonderful mixture of different stakeholders of police that would have a positive impact on the efficacy of criminal justice system in the long run,
2. Further, the non-police students could actually grasp the challenges of policing through this study which will change their mindset about the misconception over policing.
3. Furthermore, this police-public blending will be an important catalyst to promote community policing in Bangladesh.

The Masters Course is designed to study on applied sides of crime and police management with a strong emphasis on contemporary policy and practices. It is an up-to-date and high-quality course

for the eligible students aimed at developing skills, expertise and knowledge to think critically about the dynamics and patterns of crime as well as how the efficient leaderships can be grown to address these challenges in the globalized world.

The program is a part-time course that will conduct mostly in the evening sessions and on the weekends. It takes place over one year in two semesters academic year starting in the July every calendar year. It has incorporated sixteen key modules and it possesses 40 credits. The modules cover a wide range of topics and use a range of delivery styles including seminars, lectures, symposia, practical exercises and supervised research to make them participatory, interesting and effective.

The supervised research is allocated on an one-to-one basis and exclusively designed to develop analytical skills of the students. The teachers are selected considering their academic excellence in their respective subjects. They are from police and reputed public & private universities. Students are provided independent study times. They have access to college libraries, computer and internet facilities. In some cases, students support materials will be available through a virtual learning system. Upon completion of the degree program, graduates are expected to be better prepared to assume leadership roles and act as change agents in their respective departments by conducting improved policy analysis and assessing law enforcement effectiveness through a rigorous research approach. They will also be able to identify the current trends in the areas of policing, criminal justice system and criminology.
