Profile of a Police Leader:

Khandker Golam Faruq, bpm (Bar), ppm assumed office as the 13th Rector of Police Staff College Bangladesh on 20 February, 2022. He is one of the most iconic senior officers of Bangladesh Police and has immense experience in the areas of crime and organizational management. He has obtained his Honors in BSc (Agriculture) from Sher-e-Bangla Agricultural University, Dhaka. He holds Master's Degree in Political Science from the Asian University of Bangladesh.

He began his professional career as a member of Bangladesh Civil Service (Police) under the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh on 20 January 1991. He is a member of the 12th BCS batch. He started his career as Assistant Superintendent of Police at 4-APBN Bogra. After serving there, he joined

CMP Chattogram. His next workplace was Khagrachori District where he served diligently for more than three years. His last workstation as ASP was DMP Dhaka - the largest police unit of Bangladesh Police. Afterwards, he served as Additional SP at the districts of Khulna and Satkhira. After getting promoted as Police Super, his first posting place was Police Headquarters as AIG Confidential.

Due to his dedication, intelligence and hard work, Khandker Golam Faruq was appointed as Superintendent of Police (SP) in numerous districts such as Thakurgaon, Kishoreganj, Jhalokathi, Jamalpur, and Mymensingh. As Additional DIG, he worked at DMP, Dhaka and Dhaka Range Police. Afterwards, He worked as Additional Commissioner (Traffic) at DMP. He also served as DIG of Rangpur Range Police and Chattogram Range Police. Later on he was appointed as Principal of Bangladesh Police Academy, Sardah, Rajshahi.

As a recognition of his extraordinary and exemplary service to the people, he has been awarded Bangladesh Police Medal (bpm-Sheba) twice, in 2006 and in 2018. He was awarded the President Police Medal (ppm-Sheba) in 2015. These are the most prestigious professional awards in Bangladesh Police. He was also the proud recipient of the IGP Exemplary Good service badge in 2019. He attended different training courses at home and abroad including "INTERPOL and Federal Bureau of Investigation International Law Enforcement Critical Infrastructure Symposium" in 2014 and a special training in Nepal, held in 2019. He visited many countries such as South Korea, China, Thailand, Turkey and the United States. He served in peacekeeping missions of the United Nations in Angola from 1997 to 1999.

He is happily married with Ms Sharmin Akter Khan and blessed with three daughters. At his leisure hours, he likes to spend time with his family and he also likes to travel both home and abroad. His favorite sport is tennis. He is a source of inspiration to all the officers of Bangladesh Police because of his successful and impact-filled career. In particular, he is renowned as one of the most hardworking and professionally sincere senior police officers with extensive experience of serving the nation. It is hoped that Police Staff College Bangladesh will rise to new heights under the astute and visionary leadership of its new Rector.



Training Activities

Mid-Career Course: 4th General Administration and Financial Management Certificate Course:

Police Staff College's General Administration and Financial Management Certificate Course (GAFMCC) is a special course for Additional SPs of Bangladesh Police. The 4th GAFMCC was held from 6 February to 24 March 2022. This seven-week training course is to be followed by a one-week foreign tour. This course is designed for imparting knowledge on administration and financial management for mid-level officers.

There was a total of 25 participants in the 4th GAFMCC, all of whom are from 28th BCS batch. The very first batch of graduates of the GAFMCC were from 27th BCS batch. All officers of the rank of Additional SP of Bangladesh Police will undergo this mandatory training from now onward. The program of the 4th batch was inaugurated by Md. Matiur Rahman Shiekh, MDS (Training) of Police Staff College Bangladesh

Learning Objectives for GAFMCC:

- To enhance knowledge on public procurement process
- To enhance knowledge on facilities of to enhance the knowledge on financial management skills to run different police units as DDO
- To enhance knowledge on preparing annual budget and its implementation

Course Methods:

In this course, the participants enhance their knowledge and understanding of financial management through class discussion, informal study groups and formal class presentation, which also enhance their communication and collaboration skills. They learn how managers should conduct their financial transactions effectively and

with integrity. Modern-day financial management is also related to money laundering, corruption, mobile financing etc. and the course content discuss many cases and examples involving various companies, giving the participants an all-round perspective on financial management. The Rector, Police Staff College Bangladesh inaugurated the course. After completing 7 weeks' training, participants will attain foreign exposure visit for one week as part of enhancing professional skill & knowledge. This was the 4th batch of the program, held from 27 March to 19 May 2022. With a total of thirteen modules, this course also has field trips and off-campus visits. Learning Objectives for PLMCC:

- Develop present & future leadership in policing.
- Provide wisdom to enforce managerial capability, operational and commanding skill
- Understand the important components of criminal justice administration system.
- Understand the effective inspection and supervision techniques

Expected Outcomes:

After this course, participants are expected to be able to:

- Critically examine the leadership behaviors and managerial skills required to mobilize others to achieve organizational outcomes
- Acquire a strong mental capability to face the challenges in the different arena of the profession like disaster management, public order management or even stress management.
- Analyze the plan for complex management problems
- Broaden their knowledge on executive level decisions, particularly in the areas of policy, human resource management and public accountability.

ATA Course on Behavioral Observation Skills

The Behavioral Observation Skills Course was held from 3 to 7 April 2022 at Police Staff College Bangladesh. The course was coordinated by the Anti-Terrorism Assistance (ATA) program of the U.S. Department of State. Participants came from Aviation Security (AVSEC), Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB), Hazrat Shajalal International Airport (HSIA) and Airport Armed Police Battalion personnel. This course was specially designed for the officers who have to deal with challenges in securing settings like international airports, (Detailed Participants' List, Page-23)

ATA Course on Investigating Terrorist Incidents

The "Investigating Terrorist Incidents" course was arranged in partnership with the Anti-Terrorism Assistance (ATA) program supported by the US Embassy, Dhaka. The duration of this course was from the 6th to the 24th of March, 2022. Officers of Bangladesh Police ranked Additional Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Inspector and Sub Inspector attended this course. A total of 24 participants, all of them from Anti-Terrorism Unit (ATU) of Bangladesh Police, attended the course. (Detailed Participants' List, Page-24)

Objective of the course:

There is a constant development in crime scene investigation for working with the police or specialized anti-terrorist units which allow the collection and analysis of materials by the full range of forensic techniques. In

addition, advanced forensics can have a role in the identification of victims or even suspects from bodies or body parts by DNA techniques. In terms of investigating terrorist incidents, akin to a traditional scene of crime, it is important that the forensic investigations start at the terrorist scene as soon as possible before traces and other physical evidence have been contaminated, destroyed or lost.

The topics under discussion in this course include terrorist tactics and trends, community engagement to combat terrorism, intelligence-led policing, assessing terrorist threats, developing counter terrorism strategies, terrorist financing, sharing investigation information and related issues.

ATA Course on Fraudulent Document Recognition and Behavioral Analysis: Train the Trainer

The special course kicked off in the 17th of April and continued till the 25th of April 2022. This specialized training was attended by participants ranked Additional Superintendent of Police to Assistant Sub-Inspector, working in Bangladesh Police's Special Branch. This course delivered theoretical and practical insights on document appraisal, detection of fake papers, analysis of suspicious behaviour and combined technological and human aspects with a view to facilitating further dissemination of the learnings among Bangladesh Police personnel. (Detailed Participants' List, Page-25) The ultimate aim of the course is geared toward improving expertise and skills among the trainees and improve regional security in the process.



Selected participants from the Behavioral Analysis Course held in the first week of April 2022 were chosen to as trainees in the Training of Trainers (ToT) course. Both the April phase and ToT phase were comprised of trainees from the Special Branch of Bangladesh Police. In the inaugural session, the Lead Instructor mentioned the need for participatory and active class involvement of the trainees. It transpired that, throughout the duration of the course, the instructors gave laudable efforts to engage the trainees and generate a two-way learning path in each and every session. Ultimately, the sincere and dedicated efforts of the instructors led to the creation of a facilitative learning environment.

In line with Bangladesh Police's training philosophy and the ATA program's mandate, this ToT course aimed to generate sustainable propagation of the learnings and experiences disseminated in the course content.

FTK Digital Forensics Certification & Malware Analysis Consultation

The training course on “FTK Digital Forensics Certification” was organized under the aegis of the Anti Terrorism Assistance (ATA) program of the US Department of State. It started from the 10th of April 2022, with a total of 12 police personnel from rank of Additional Superintendent of Police to Sub-Inspectors as participants. These personnel were all from the specialized Cyber Crime unit of Counter Terrorism & Transnational Crime (CTTC) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

The course attempted to provide training on the latest technological advancement regarding digital forensics. The combination of theory and hands-on practice were designed to provide optimum benefit to enhance the capability of Bangladesh Police in dealing with the cyber menace. The course content was deemed extremely beneficial by the participants themselves, from the perspective of capacity building and knowledge transfer. The technological know-how that enables the utilization of latest hardware and software tools would go a long way in enhancing the cyber policing capabilities of our law enforcement agencies, which is of particular significance owing to the rapid proliferation of digitally enabled crime. The course re-emphasized the importance of transnational cooperation for jointly combating the global menace of cyber crime and cyber threats.

The malware analysis course was held from 17 April to 21 April. This course built on the learnings of the digital forensics basics taught in the previous course and delved into greater detail on the specifics of analyzing, detecting and troubleshooting malware. The issue of online and offline viruses and other forms of malware is a source of considerable security threats. In the context of today’s uber-connected world, the advent of artificial intelligence, driverless cars, automated drones and mass digitalization of all things under the Internet of Things is set to pose far more challenging security threats arising from malwares. The course aimed to present trainees with an in-depth view into the world of malicious cyber threats, and the participants are expected to play a vital role in fulfilling the law enforcement imperative of making a safer world through combating common cyber threats of today and tomorrow.

Research Activities

Draft Report Sharing Workshop on Research Project “Quality Policing in Bangladesh: Life, Sacrifice & Commitment of Woman Police”

This workshop was organized by the Research and Publication Wing of PSC with the support of the Human Rights Programme, UNDP. The participants of this workshop included ASP to DIG of Bangladesh Police, researchers, and professors of different universities. The total number of participants was 26. The Chief Guest was Additional IGP Mr. Md. Khandakar Golam Faruk BPM (Bar), PPM, the Rector of PSC. Md. Matiur Rahman Sheikh, MDS (Training) was present as the Special guest. Md. The inclusion of women personnel in Bangladesh Police was initiated in 1974, as per an unprecedented decision by the then government of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Although the inclusion of women police officers is not a recent phenomenon in Bangladesh, it is one of the fast growing women inclusions in any police force and comes with its own set of challenges for the women police personnel. Since their inclusion in the police force, women police officers of Bangladesh have played a significant role in providing quality policing.

Since the role and experiences of women police officers in Bangladesh have not yet received ample academic attention, this research attempted to examine the personal and police life, sacrifice, and challenges of women police officers in the context of quality policing. The stated aims of this research project are twofold. Firstly, it aims to identify the challenges women police officers face in their workplace, in society, and at home Secondly, the study further investigates how the role of women police officers in Bangladesh can improve the quality of policing in general and their role in ensuring women's and children's rights. The research methodology and findings were presented by the lead researcher, and the lively and dynamic feedback gained from the discussion will contribute to an optimized final version of the research project.

Academic Activities

Masters in Applied Criminology and Police Management MACPM 6th Batch Begins its Journey

The sixth batch of students for the professional Masters Course on “Applied Criminology and Police Management” was inaugurated on the 26th of February, 2022, at Police Staff College Bangladesh. Rector Khandker Golam Faruq BPM (Bar) PPM was present in the event as the chief guest. As the Guest of Honor, Mr. Badiuzzaman, Controller of Examinations, National University was present along with Md. Abdul Quddus Amin, Vice Rector, Police Staff College Bangladesh who presided over the inaugural ceremony. Senior officials of Bangladesh Police, faculty members from different universities, students of the Master’s program and Police Staff College Bangladesh personnel attended the opening ceremony.

A total of 34 students have enrolled for the sixth batch of MACPM. Among the students, there are officials of Bangladesh Police as well as non-police students from different professions. This program emphasizes on crime reduction policy and practices along with the development of leadership skill, which will help to strengthen professional knowledge and skill on policing. This course is open to all for three important reasons: the non-police students are expected to be social worker, human rights activist, lawyer or media personnel so it is very likely that this course would be a wonderful mixture of different stakeholders of police that would have a positive impact on the efficacy of criminal justice system in the long run, further the non-police students could actually grasp the challenges of policing through this study which will change their mindset about the misconception over policing and furthermore this police-public blending will be an important catalyst to promote community policing in Bangladesh.

The Masters Course is designed to study on applied sides of crime and police management with a strong emphasis on contemporary policy and practices. It is an up-to-date and high-quality course for the eligible students aimed at developing skills, expertise and knowledge to think critically as well as how efficient leadership can be grown to address relevant challenges in the globalized world.

The program is a part-time course that will conduct mostly in the evening sessions and in the weekends. It takes place over one year in two semesters starting in the July academic year. It has incorporated sixteen key modules and it possesses 40 credits. It also accommodates a unit of Executive English Language skill, which is a non-credit unit aims at strengthening the skills of communicative English of the students. The modules cover a wide range of topics and use a range of delivery styles including seminars, lectures, symposia, practical exercises and supervised research to make them participatory, interesting and effective. The supervised research is allocated on a one-to-one basis and exclusively designed to develop analytical skill of the students. Upon completion of the degree program, graduates are expected to be better prepared to assume leadership roles and act as change agents. They will also be able to identify the current trends in the areas of policing, criminal justice system and criminology. (Detailed Students' List, Page-27)

The teachers are selected considering their academic excellence in their respective subjects. Faculty members are a mix of police senior leaders and faculty members of reputed universities.
