

Transnational Organized Crime: SAARC Perspective

Police Staff College Bangladesh organized a three-week long course titled "Transnational Organized Crime: SAARC Perspective" from 27 January to 14 February 2013. It was the first of its kind in the SAARC region. The objectives of the course were to combat transnational crimes in SAARC Region, to share knowledge and experience in professional issues of common interest, to maximize SAARC Police Cooperation and to exchange the best practices of policing.

The Training on Community Policing focuses on crime and social disorder through the delivery of police services that include aspects of traditional law enforcement, as well as prevention of crime, problem-solving, community engagement, and partnerships. balances reactive responses through service delivery with proactive problemsolving centered on the causes of crime and disorder. It requires police and citizens to join together as partners. Since Bangladesh is a densely populated country, police-people ratio is obviously higher, and this may be the prime cause why we are giving emphasis on community policing.

Police Staff College Bangladesh and Asia Foundation have jointly started a fourday training program from 14 January 2013 to 17 January 14, 2013 for Master Instructors who will train the field-level officers throughout the country. Mr. Md. Nazmul Haque PPM, Re ctor, Police Staff College Bangladesh, Mr. Md. Matiur Rahman Sheikh, Director Training, Police Staff College Bangladesh and Shanna Tova O'Reilly, Program Director, Asia Foundation, were present in the opening ceremony of the training program. Mr. Md. Nazmul Haque PPM has stressed on the need of more trained officers to expedite the community policing campaign to address the problems of common people.

Trafficking in Human Beings Investigation Course

Trafficking in Human Beings Investigation Course was held at Police Staff College Bangladesh from 07 April to 11th April 2013. The course was sponsored by Police Reform Program (PRP). Twenty-two officers of the rank of Inspector and Sub-Inspector took part in that course.

It is a well recognized fact that trafficking in Human Beings is a gross violation of human rights. Women and children become more vulnerable to trafficking in the context of a developing country like Bangladesh with a high density of population, unemployment, vulnerability to natural disaster and lack of natural resources. The increasing vulnerability of women and children is linked with the process of migration. And, in many cases, it ends up in trafficking.

There is no denying the fact that we are lagging far behind the international standard in terms of applying Investigation Techniques in Human Trafficking cases. Our conventional approach to investigation cannot match with organized criminal networks at local, regional and international levels. So, we have to apply modern investigation techniques to enter deep into the human trafficking cases.

Hospital Based Management of Mass Casualty Incidents Course

Two courses on "Hospital Based Management of Mass Casualty Incidents" were held at Police Staff College Bangladesh sponsored by US Department of State Anti-Terrorism Assistance Program and coordinated by Regional Security Office, US Embassy, Dhaka. "1" Hospital Based Management of Mass Casualty Incidents Course" was held from 25 February to 28 February 2013 and 23 officers from Bangladesh Police, Bangladesh Army, Fire Service and Civil Defense, Department of Disaster Management, Specialized Hospitals attended the course. "2" Hospital Based Management of Mass Casualty Incidents Course" was held from 03 March to 07 March 2013 and 18 officers took part in the course.

This course is designed to provide healthcare facility administrators, planners, medical staff, and community responders the skills required to coordinate the preparation and management of a mass casualty incident, whether terrorist-related, accidental, or natural. This course introduces you to the organizational skills and knowledge requirements to maintain healthcare facility continuity of operations while protecting staff and patients.

Learning Objectives

The objectives of the course are to:

- Describe the principles for managing mass casualty incidents.
- 2. Describe the emergency management planning process.
- Describe the hospital incident command system and its integration in the emergency management planning process.
- 4. Describe basic principles of triage in a mass casualty incident.
- Discuss the various signs, symptoms, and risks involving exposure to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear (CBRN) agents and the actions necessary to reduce the loss of life.
- Describe an organized approach for patient management during a mass casualty incident.
- 7. Discuss an organized approach for surge planning.
- 8. Develop an Incident Action Plan to manage a simulated mass casualty incident.

A two-week long training on "Investigating Terrorist Incidents" was held at Police Staff College Bangladesh from March 31 to April 11, 2013 Dhaka. The course was sponsored by US Department of State Anti-Terrorism Assistance Program and coordinated by the Regional Security Office, US Embassy, Dhaka. A total number of 25 participants took part in the training. The instructors of the course were Mr. Frank J. Weicks, Gordon Taylor and Cecelia Woods. This course is designed to enhance the police investigator's ability to investigate, identify, and prosecute suspects responsible for terrorist incidents and activities. The course includes an overview of criminal investigation techniques, including

- 1. Crime scene investigation 2. Interviewing 3. Case file management
- 4. Processing and analyzing investigative information

Refresher Training on Community Policing for Community Policing Officers

Three Courses on "Refresher Training on Community Policing for Community Policing Officers" were held at Police Staff College Bangladesh on 27, 28 and 29 January 2013. These courses were organized by Police Reform Program (PRP), UNDP. A total number of 95 officers of the rank of Inspector and Sub-Inspector attended the courses.

Community policing focuses on crime and social disorder through the delivery of police services that include aspects of traditional law enforcement, as well as prevention, problem-solving, community engagement, and partnerships. It balances reactive responses to calls for service with proactive problem-solving centered on the causes of crime and disorder. It requires police and citizens to join together as partners. Since Bangladesh is a densely populated country, police-people ratio is obviously higher, and this may be the prime cause why we have to resort to community policing.

These refresher courses are intended to see whether the officers trained before are on the right track or not. They also try to solve the problem faced by the officers while working in the field level. The officers do brain-storming and put forward the outcome of their group discussion through group presentation.
